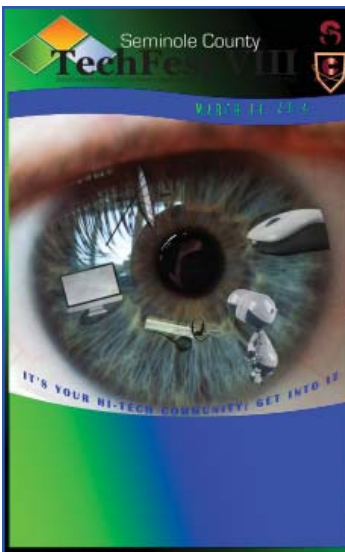

Student Showcase

AA Degree Program

Students who attend Crooms Academy of Information Technology currently have the opportunity to participate in dual enrollment courses through Seminole State College. These Information Technology elective courses are taught on-site at Crooms by SCPS teachers who also qualify as Seminole State instructors. Beginning in 2011-12, Dr. Griffin and Dr. Collins began discussion of the opportunity for Crooms AOIT students to earn a high school diploma and AA degree simultaneously. This goal was finalized during the first semester of the 2013-14 school year, by a joint SCPS-Seminole State planning team that has been meeting to develop an ePathway for Crooms students to have the option to earn both a high school diploma from SCPS and an Associate of Arts (AA) degree from Seminole State.

The team has successfully articulated that pathway and leaders from both institutions have agreed to begin implementing this option in the 2014-2015 school year.

Members of the class of 2016 at Crooms (current 10th grade students) will be the first group eligible to pursue the joint HS diploma/AA degree option. To successfully launch the project, a cohort of at least 20 rising juniors must choose to participate. Principal Demetria Faison and her team invited eligible students and their parents to an information meeting in January, 2014 that was jointly attended by officials from Seminole State. A customized "course map" to graduation was presented to each eligible student to assist in making an informed decision about whether to participate in this option.

History of Crooms

As Crooms Academy confronts the role of preparing students for a high tech world, it emerges on the grounds of one of the oldest high schools in Seminole County. Founded in 1926 by Professor Crooms as Seminole County's first high school for black students, Crooms has a rich and varied past. Professor Crooms and his wife, Wealthy, donated the land on which the school was constructed. Under their guidance and teaching, many doctors, lawyers, teachers, and business people have graduated from Crooms.



Notable graduates include U.S. Representative Alcee Hastings; George Allen, the first black graduate of the University of Florida Law School; Oswald Bronson Sr., President of Bethune-Cookman College; and Bob Thomas, Sanford's first black city commissioner. Professor Crooms led Crooms Academy until his retirement in 1953.

In 1970, Seminole County was desegregated and Crooms lost its identity as a community high school. Its role changed several times and has included an administrative center, a school for students with behavior problems, and a place for pregnant teenagers. Most recently, it was a school for academically struggling students. In 1973, the original building burned and in the past years the other school buildings deteriorated. In 2000, the U.S.

Justice Department agreed to lift Seminole's desegregation order by 2003 if the county met certain conditions. Included in this was rebuilding Crooms Academy and turning it into an academy of information technology.

Professor Crooms is remembered as a man ahead of his times as he broke educational boundaries for black students in Seminole County. Today, Crooms AoIT remains in this tradition as it

establishes new territory in technology education at the high school level.

Crooms Academy of Information Technology is a dedicated magnet school that provides students with a wide range of education choices. In addition to graduating with a regular high school diploma and a National Academy Foundation Certificate, every student will be afforded the opportunity to select from a wide variety of Information Technology Certifications. Some of the certifications offered are A+ Essentials, A+ Practical Application, Adobe Dreamweaver Associate, Adobe Flash Associate, Adobe Photoshop Associate, Adobe Premiere Pro, CCNA, MOS—Word, Excel, PowerPoint, and MTA Windows. Starting next year, Crooms is partnering with Seminole State to offer an Associates of Arts Degree pathway for Crooms students.

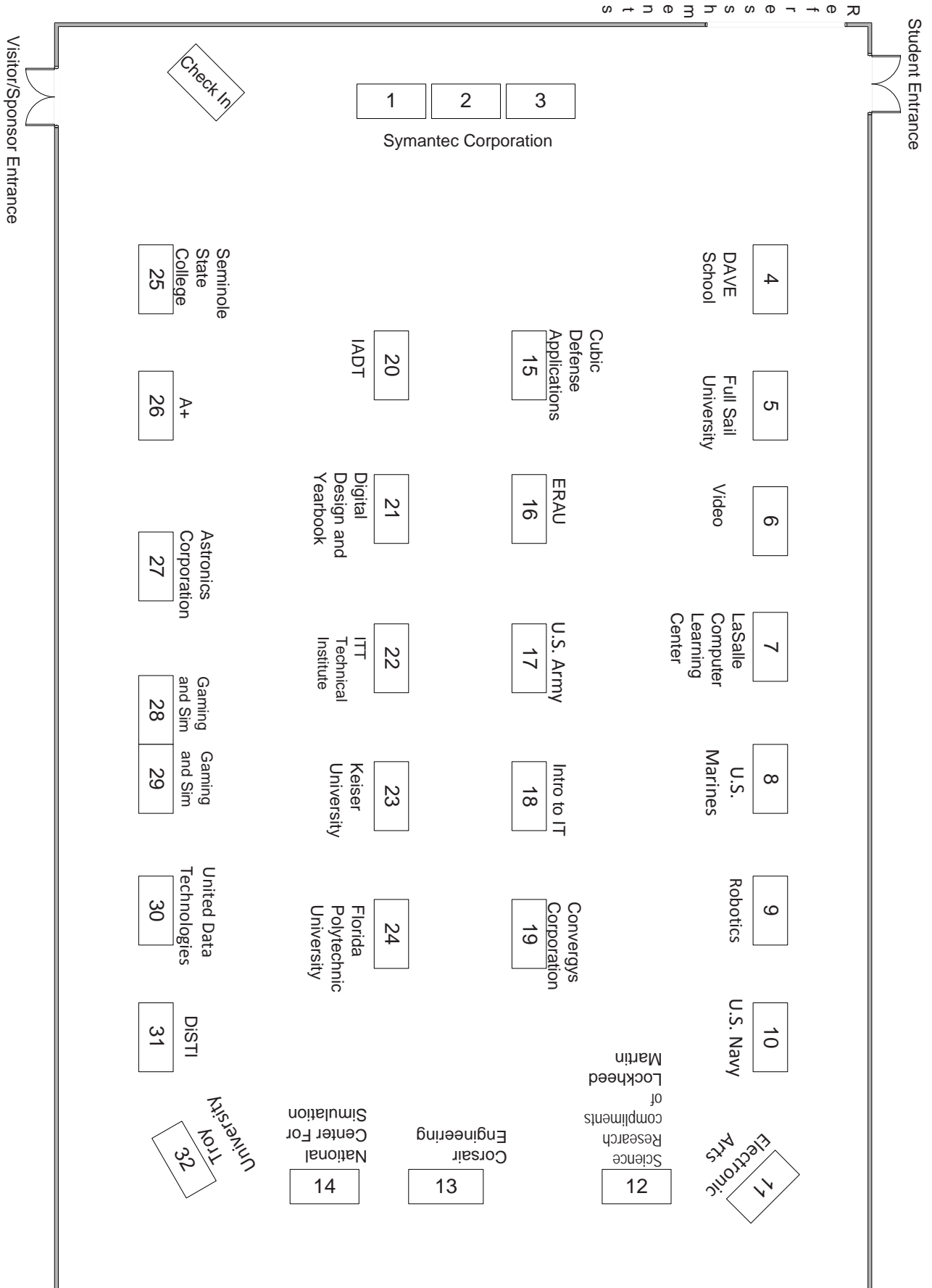
